Accelerated College & Career Transition (AC²T) Program

AC²T program, formerly AEWG, is an independent study program that provides 16 to 24 year old youth low in credits with an alternative way to earn a high school diploma. Students are assigned courses and coursework based on transcript evaluation and demonstrated competencies. Students are responsible for meeting with teachers and completing required course work. Students complete the majority of their coursework independently and have access to the AC²T program when they need assistance. Work is submitted as scheduled by the teacher. Students must make adequate academic progress to remain in the program.

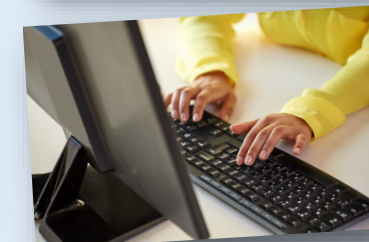

High School Diploma/ High School Equivalency

Career and Technical Education

English as a Second Language
Evans offers all levels of ESL classes. Lessons focus on oral and written communication for daily living skills as well as for academic and career contexts.

Adult Basic Education (ABE)
(Pre-High School Classes)
This program is designed for students seeking to improve their reading, writing and math skills to succeed in the high school program, and to prepare for the high school equivalency exam or career and technical training.

High School Diploma/HS Equivalency Exam:
Students may earn a high school diploma by completing 170 credits from 34 specific courses, or passing the English HS Equivalency Exam and complete 10 specific courses, or passing the Spanish HS Equivalency Exam and complete 14 specific courses. Credits previously earned at any accredited secondary or foreign school equivalent to high school level may be accepted.

Career Training:
These short-term courses are designed to prepare students for entry level employment, increase employability skills as well as earn a certificate of completion.
